

International Law School Membership Application

NALP membership is available to any law school fully or provisionally accredited by the American Bar Association, or any law school outside the United States whose membership is approved by the Board of Directors. Non-US law schools must therefore apply to the Board for membership by providing all of the information listed below. In considering international law school membership applications, the Board will take into account a variety of factors, including whether the school offers professional career services to its students in a nondiscriminatory manner, and whether the school is recognized or accredited by the highest appropriate body in the school's home country. Non-US law schools wishing to apply for NALP membership should complete this application and return it to the NALP office in Washington, DC, along with any supporting documents or materials. The NALP Board of Directors generally meets on a quarterly basis and applications will be considered at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting following receipt of the application materials.

Membership Criteria and Limitations

Membership in NALP is institutionally based. Institutional members must be legal employers, ABA-accredited law schools, or non-U.S. based law schools whose admission to membership is approved by the NALP Board of Directors. Employer members may include bar associations, nonprofit public interest organizations, government agencies, or any other employer whose active engagement in the recruitment of lawyers and law students is primarily for purposes of employment within its individual organization. Each institutional membership includes one (1) individual membership – referred to as the Primary (voting) member. Additional individuals at an institutional member may join as Associate Members for an additional fee.
