The larger the change, the more leadership is required.

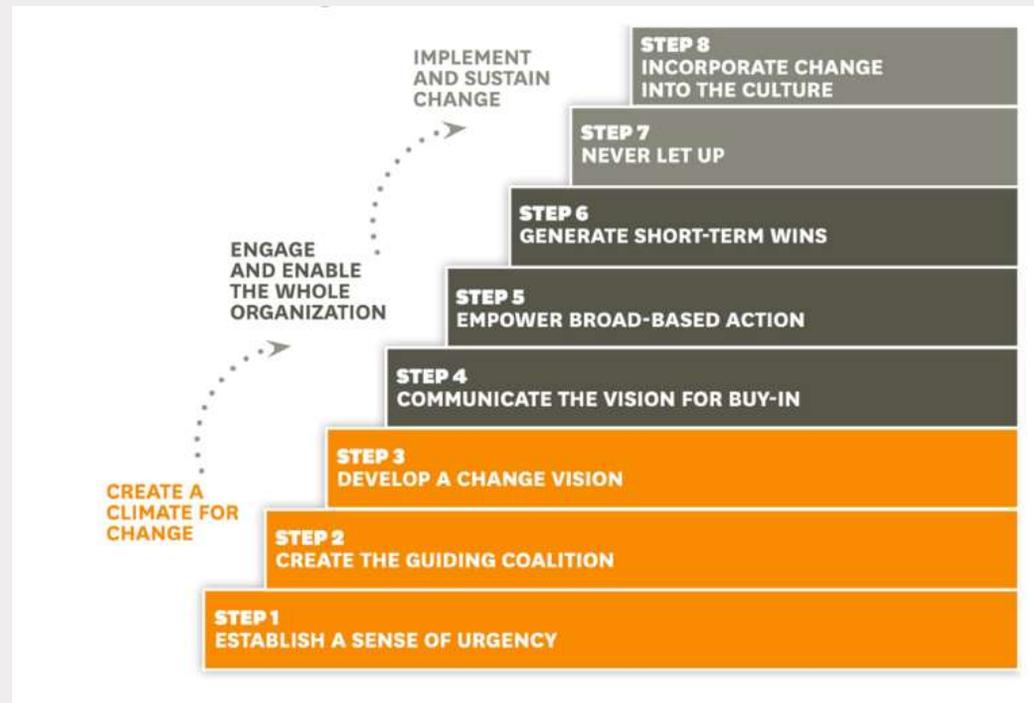


Become a Change Leader

Establish Our Sense of Urgency

We must *not*:

- Leap to creating vision or strategy before we've made our urgency undeniable
- Focus exclusively on building a "rational" business case with lengthy analysis

Establish Our Sense of Urgency

Tactics for building *true* urgency:

- Bring outside reality in
- Behave with urgency every day
- Find opportunity in crisis
- Communicate!
